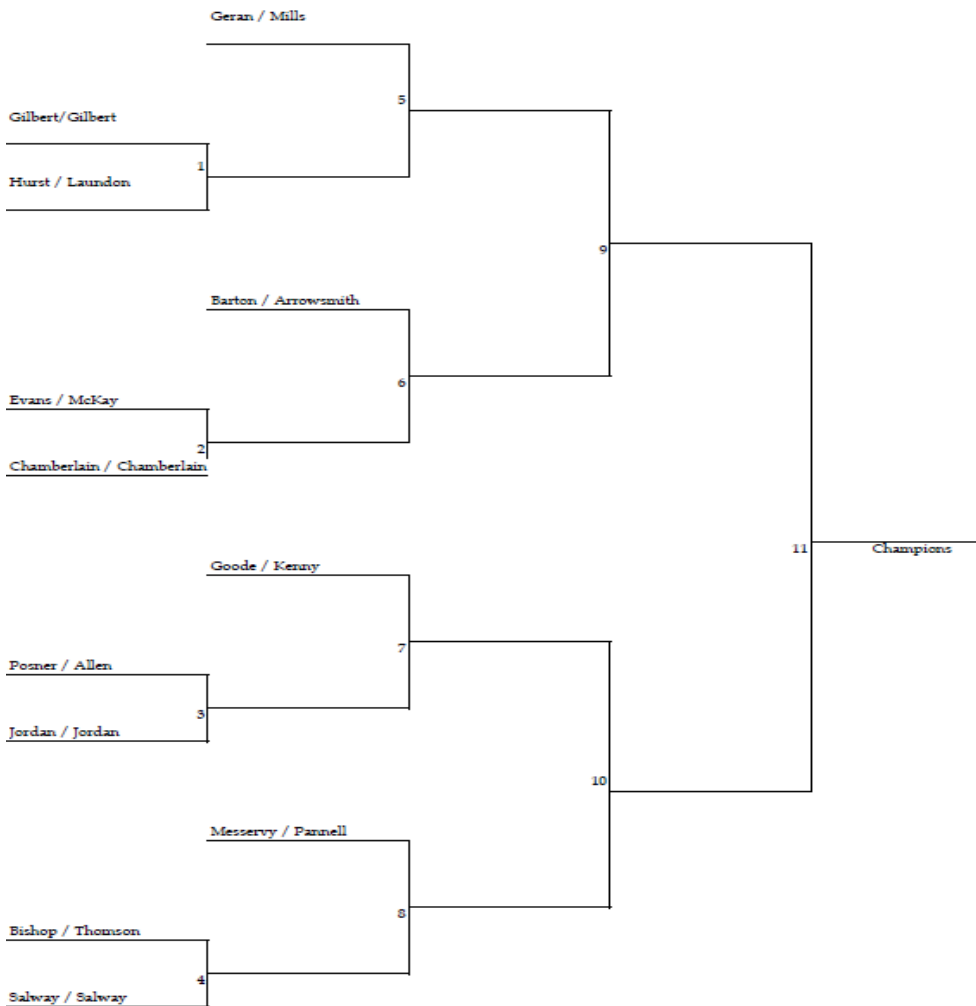

OTHER INFO

Duties of Markers

As a reminder for Markers – besides wearing your club uniform when on duty, a list of duties is below:

Marker duty tips for singles game

Preparation

- Assemble equipment – chalk/spray chalk, box string measure, some wedges, pen or pencil, scorecard, coin, shot indicators (if required)
- Meet players, umpire, and other officials
- Advise players not to bowl until touchers are marked
- Ask for permission to remove dead bowls
- Identify each players bowls
- Ask players how they would like distances indicated – metric or imperial
- Toss the coin

During game

- Where jack is delivered improperly ensure that correct player rolls the first bowl
- Position jack so that identifying print is on top
- Make sure that the player delivers a legal length
- Take a position between two metres to rear of jack and one metre to the side and so a shadow is not cast on the head
- Move slightly forward of the jack immediately after delivery of drive to avoid bowls hitting your legs
- Remain still when players deliver bowls
- When reviewing the head anticipate questions from the players
- Do not provide advice or assistance to the players
- Indicate position of the jack or shot bowl with your hand
- Indicate distance with your hands

Completion of an end

- Wait for the players to declare the head before recording the result
- Measure only if requested by the players
- If the measure is too close to call, request the umpire to measure
- Advise the players of the score

Completion of the game

- Congratulate the players and shake hands
- Complete the scores and transfer to front of the card
- Note the time of completion of the game as it may be required for a protest in respect of bowls
- Ensure the players sign the card
- Return the card to the Controlling Body

For those History Buffs

Below is information supplied by Leigh Chamberlain for those interested in the history of the club and surrounds. (*Source is TDHS and Lee Bull. Thanks to researchers Andrew Darbyshire and Peter Brown of the St Lucia Historical Society for sharing their research.*)

The Toowong Bowls Club is positioned on Robert Cribb's former Lang Farm. On 25 May 1852, he purchased 19 acres 2 roods of dense scrub for £39. This was Lot 7 at the bend in the river on the eastern side of Toowong Creek, which he named Lang Farm, after his mentor Dr Lang. Allotment 7 extended east, along the river from the mouth of Toowong Creek, upstream, to what was later named Gailey Creek (in Sandford Street).

He added to his holdings in the Lang Farm area on 16 Dec 1853, by purchasing lot 28 downstream of Toowong Creek, bordered by Burns Rd and neighbouring Lot 27. This was 38 acres 3 roods and the price paid was £253 1s 11d. There was no bridge but farmers could ford the creek at low tide.

The actual club premises is located on part of what was referred to as the "outer paddocks of Lang Farm".

Banana trees grew on the hill slopes (probably along Macdonnell, Eskmount, Josling, Holmes, Aston and Herbert Streets and Burns Road. It is reported in 1859 that one left one's horse tied up at a tree near the creek to the north of where the roundabout is now situated at Burns Rd and cross the creek by foot on the fallen log which served as a bridge and walk down to Lang Farm and hence through the vine and almost impenetrable forest to the farms at what was called "The Pocket", now St Lucia and Long Pocket. An elderly gentleman aged 70, a Mr Adsett, was lost for 2 days in the vine forest in the St Lucia area along what is now Sir Fred Schonell Drive before he was found.

Cribb sometimes tenanted his farm. One tenant was James Hawkins, who rented part of the farm in 1872, announcing to the local newspaper he killed fifty snakes in his first year and five the following spring. Despite the snakes, Mr Hawkins remained at the farm for several years. The Acclimatization Society exhibited olive oil from olives grown at Lang Farm in 1873 and Mr Hawkins advertised saplings for sale at Lang Farm in 1877, which was after Richard Gailey bought the property.

Next time you are walking up and down your rink at the change of ends, think about the snakes which used to live here—we whinge at the cheeky butcher bird which tries to pinch the biscuits at our afternoon tea—and also about the pumpkin vines which probably grew where our greens now are positioned. The soil is very fertile so it is no wonder our greens are rolling absolutely great. And as you enjoy looking at the pleasant surrounds, try to imagine the thick forest which grew on the property which was so thick that becoming lost was a real possibility.
